

## ADDENDUM TO THE FINAL ANNOUNCEMENT

- On Wednesday May 6 when you come to REGISTRATION (opened from 13:00 in the Foyer of the building called “**Colegiul Academic**” (also known locally as “**Casa Universitarilor**”), belonging to The “**Babeş-Bolyai**” University Cluj-Napoca, Street Emmanuel de Martonne no. 1 (corner with Street Mihail Kogălniceanu) you have the chance to visit **TWO exhibitions**: a) in the Foyer, THE LAST DYNOSAURS OF TRANSYLVANIA (free guided visit for participants in the Congress); b) in the Hall “Paul Sima” of “Colegiul Academic” an art exhibition of ION CONSTANTINESCU: COLOURED WINDOWS, Myth, Religion, History, Art.

- In any country, in case of any congress, the only thing that cannot be "arranged" by organizers is WEATHER! Look on the link: <http://vremea.ido.ro/Cluj.htm> to see the forecast, which is changing every day (I compared the forecast for the days Wednesday May 6 to Sunday May 10 in three days and found major differences. However, what was in common was the variability in temperatures and probability to rain.

Prepare for warm weather (up to 25, even 30 degrees Celsius) in one day, and cool weather (10-15 degrees Celsius) in another day. RAINS are forecasted almost every day during May 6 – May 10, so please bring an umbrella, appropriate shoes, raincoats. They are also necessary for the Tour of Cluj-Napoca, when we have to walk on pedestrian streets to visit historical centre, in the Botanical Gardens during the Tour of Cluj-Napoca (Saturday May 9) or in the Turda salt mines (Salina Turda) and Alba Iulia on Excursion (May 10).

**NEW: I checked now the forecast and it looks now that we will have beautiful, sunny days next week, warm days (up to 25-30 degrees Celsius). Be however, prepared for some rains (any time) and cool mornings and evenings.**

I do hope that you will have a fruitful and enjoyable visit here and will feel the traditional hospitality of Romanians and will enjoy everything!
